


## 15 Degrees Supply list



This quilt is made from strip sets and a 15 degree ruler. It is all straight sewing. The curves are an illusion.



This is the ruler that you need. It is a 15 degree ruler from “Stack and Whack”. \$12.00. You do not need this ruler before class. I will bring these rulers to MBQP. If you need this ruler, email me and I will reserve one for you. ([patticnc@bellsouth.net](mailto:patticnc@bellsouth.net)) Prior to class, you will be cutting strips with your plain ruler.

## 15 Degrees Supply list



We are going to construct two strip sets. These strip sets are 44/45" long. Seams are 1/4 ". You are going to press the seams open. **Two strip sets will give you two blocks**, one with the red on the inside, like the block shown, and one with the red on the outside, not shown. Blocks finish about 13".

Here are the sizes to CUT the strips:

Strip set A-

1 1/2 " of white

1 1/2 " of red accent

3 1/2 " of blue print

1 1/2 " of white

For the other strip set: Strip set B

3 1-2" of white

1 1-2" of black

2 1/2" of white

## 15 Degrees Supply list

I have included a chart below for yardage. I encourage you to **use a lot of different fabrics and combinations**. Yardages are just for reference purposes. This quilt does take a lot of background fabric.

IF YOU WANT TO SEW BEFORE MBQP, YOU CAN CONSTRUCT STRIP SETS. Sets need to be straight and flat. Preferably, not wiggly like the sets in the photographs. Sew and press after each seam. Start at the same end each time. Sets need to be at least 43" long, of usable strip. If both ends are uneven, you might not have enough to cut all you pieces. (If you use fat quarters, you will need to make extra strip sets. Please don't do this.) IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, WAIT UNTIL CLASS TO SEW!!!



Make your strip sets. Press seams open and finish with some spray starch or sizing.

## 15 Degrees Supply list



You will need:

A cutting mat - at least 18" x 24", cutter, extra blades.

Sewing machine, 1/4" presser foot and an open toe appliqué foot, thread for piecing, (white) and thread to appliqué your center circles, (red?).

A square up ruler, 14" or bigger.

Marking pencil.

Fabric for blocks

Fabric for background

Fabric for center circles

1 yd of fusible web. (I will have some in class to purchase)

Decide what size quilt you want to make. Cut the strips and put them in a box so that they are flat. Do not cram your neatly pressed strips into a plastic bag.
