

Tropical Color Wheel Supply List

Sewing Machine in good working order.

Machine needles, neutral thread for piecing, ¼" foot (or foot that gives you the most accurate ¼" seam), small scissors

Cutting mat, rotary cutter, ruler(s) (one at least 6" x 24")

Small iron and pad to iron on

Pattern: Color Wheel Quilt, Designed by Pat Knoechel, Quilt in a Day. Retails for \$9.00. I will have them available in class for \$6.00 but you must text or email me by Dec. 4th to reserve a copy. I will not have extras at class.

Class Sample is a Twin (62" by 100"):

Color Wheel Strips – 18 fat quarters

Fabric selection for fat quarters:

- Start with fabrics in the primary colors: red, blue and yellow
- Next, select secondary colors in green, orange and violet
- Fill in with tertiary colors (a combination of primary and secondary colors)
- Finally add analogous colors – those that are side by side on the color wheel such as blue-green and blue violet.

Big vibrant florals and batiks from a full range of colors work well.

Note: you can do a google search for color wheels, but it can be overwhelming. I did a quick search and found the following website with 3 very good examples that you may find useful: <https://bluepearlgirlsworld.wordpress.com/tag/color-wheel/>

Background Fabric – 2 ½ yd.

The following are not needed for class:

Binding – 7/8 yd.

Backing – 6 yds of 45" wide fabric or 2 yds of 108" wide backing fabric

Batting – 70" by 108"

Prep required prior to Class:

- Fat quarters for Color Wheel Strips: Cut (3) 5" by 21" strips from each fat quarter
- Background fabric
 - Cut (8) 8" strips by WOF (width of fabric)
 - Cut (14) 1 ½" strips by WOF
- Binding: Pattern calls for (9) 3" strips. Note: I cut (9) binding strips @ 2 ¼".)

Note: if you're interested in making a Queen or King, please contact me and I will provide fabric requirements and cutting instructions.
